 to support the construction sector in its adaptation to key upcoming challenges and to promote the sustainable competitiveness of the sector



#### 5 strategic objectives:

- Stimulating favourable investment conditions
- Improving the human-capital basis of the construction sector
- Improving resource efficiency, environmental performance and business opportunities
- Strengthening the Internal Market for construction
- Fostering the global competitive position of EU construction enterprises



## **High Level Tripartite Strategic Forum for Construction**

- 5 thematic groups
- TG2 "Skills and Qualifications":
  - to map present and future construction sector needs with respect to skills, qualifications and competencies, and subsequently:
  - to identify measures to overcome barriers and skills gaps as well as find concrete proposals and solutions for adapting vocational education and training to the future needs of the construction sector and increasing the attractiveness of the sector to workers via improved working conditions and greater mobility.
