→ Managed by the European Commission:

- Erasmus for all, one of the main EU tools for investment in for education and for skills.

- European Social Fund, one of the main EU tools for supporting jobs and helping people to have better jobs.

Sector skills alliances (SSA)



Objectives

→ Bring education closer to labour market in order to better match VET provision with skills needs

→ Promote innovation, mutual trust and mobility tools

→ Target dissemination strategy to human resource managers, VET schools, etc.

→ Achieve systemic impact on training provision

Sector skills alliances



Activities supported

→ **Conclusions on skills needs** or European core profile based on robust evidence;

→ **Joint curriculum design:** translate skills or occupation profile into curricula, common standard or reference, European tools implementation)

→ **Joint curriculum delivery:** (e.g.: implementation of work based learning or innovative ways of teaching and learning; development of new learning opportunities)

→ **Dissemination**

Sector skills alliances



Sector Skills Alliances pilot call 2012

→ **Large-scale and multilateral partnerships**, with at least 7 partners covering 5 life long learning participant countries (including 4 MS).

→ **3 categories of stakeholders:** VET providers, sector expertise, policy/decision makers (at least one representative from each category).

→ **2012 Pilot Call:** 1 SSA in Energy saving technology including sustainable construction.

Sector skills alliances

2014-2020

- SSA in Erasmus for All;
- Annual calls;
- All sectors;
- Around 200 Sector Skills Alliances
- 174 Million Euros
- On average € 870.000 per SSA

The European Social Fund



→To boost employment by improving education, training and hands-on experience for:

- Workers from sectors threatened by restructuring
- Unemployed or inactive people
- Disadvantaged groups (youth, immigrants, women, persons with disabilities, older workers...)

→But also fostering entrepreneurs and job creation!

Objectives

- Strengthening people's jobs and prospects
- Improving education and training opportunities
- Promoting better prospects for the young
- **New skills for older workers**
- Fostering entrepreneurs and job creation
- Helping the integration of people with disabilities, immigrants and minorities in the job market

Activities supported

- New/upgrade of qualification and training schemes
- Accreditation of training courses
- Upgrade of the qualification framework
- Infrastructures for the delivery of training
- Etc, etc.

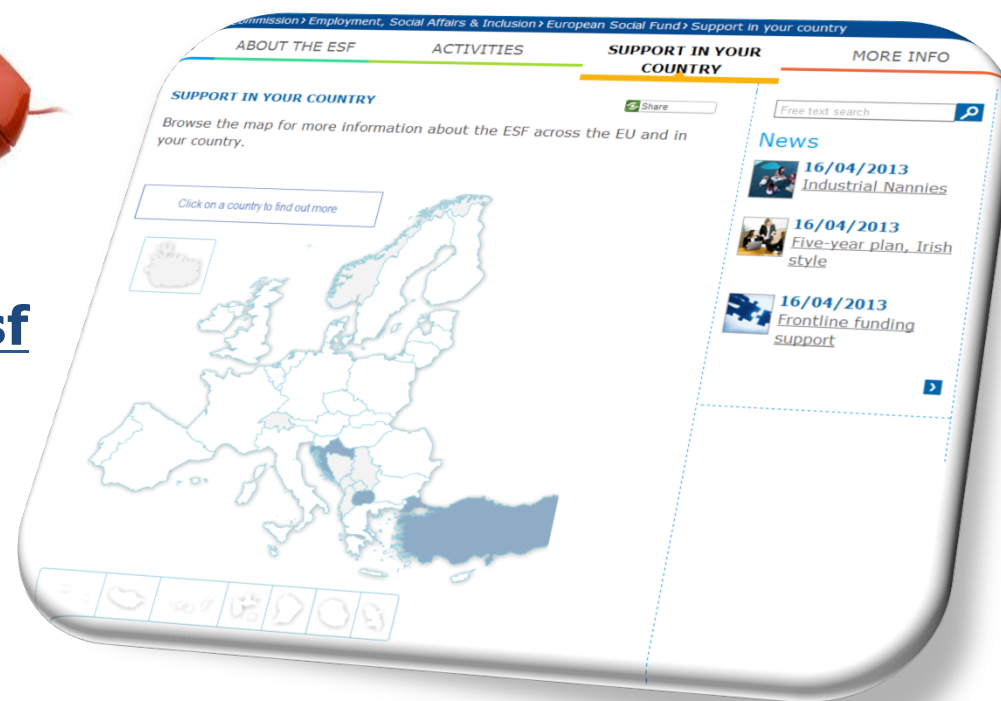

'Eco+' project (BE)

- **Project manager:** ACFI-FIAS Association - Fédération des Initiatives et Actions Sociales
- **Scope:** Give workers the opportunity to acquire skills in ecological construction and renovation.
- **Target groups:** jobseekers from disadvantaged groups
- **Methodology:**
 - Pooling knowledge and know-how of the of the training centres and their trainers in terms of educational and organisational material
 - Testing training actions



'Eco+' project (BE)

Activities

- **Coordination, planning and training preparation**
 - Plan educational phases, make the various training coherent, coordinate the creation of reference documents, evaluate the training methods
- **Trainings (skills to be taught)**
 - Clay plaster, insulation and finish (ecological insulation techniques, coating and green ceiling, ecological materials, natural painting...)
 - Green roofs material and techniques
 - Dry stone walls: sorting, stability and foundation walls, dressage seat and finishing stones.



'BATIRECO' project (FR)

- **Project manager:** BTP77 (Federation of building companies)
 - **Objectives:**
 - Strengthen the competitiveness of companies of the building sector and allow them to extend their market to the eco-construction sector
 - Support unemployed people to retrain into more promising professions in the building industry
- Key element for both **economic and employment local strategies**

'BATIRECO' project (FR)

→BATIRECO aims at:

- Make professionals acquire a **global approach** of sustainable construction and renovation of buildings
- Strengthen the technical knowledge to **improve the quality of the supply side** in the construction sector

→2 action lines:

- A progressive training package intended for craftsmen and other on-site construction workers
- A pedagogical raising awareness stage for young people engaged in a regular construction programme
